# Thought for May

May is the month when we begin to think that summer is on its way, although I remember my Mother saying to me, as a child who wanted to change into her summer school uniform, 'Ne'er cast a clout till May be out'! I knew what she meant but I have only just checked out what casting a clout meant. I see that it does indeed refer to not taking off winter clothes too soon! And the weather forecast on my phone suggests that we will be getting some of the April rains that didn't appear last month. The gardens certainly need the water.

Water is a necessity for life, but we need to help keep the balance between too little and too much, either can have a devastating effect on people all over the world. And climate change is disturbing that balance. We will reflect on this and our part in it, at our Christian Aid service on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> May. *(details on page 2)* 

This May is also the month when two of the major feasts of the Christian Church occur. The first, Ascension Day, which is 40 days after Easter, is on 13<sup>th</sup> May and the second festival, Pentecost, is on 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 50 days after Easter.

The 10 days between these great feast days have become days of waiting between Jesus' ascension into heaven and the sending of the Holy Spirit. There will be services at the church to celebrate both of these celebrations. *(details on page 4)* 

Waiting can be difficult but it is often necessary. At the time, it was necessary for the disciples to come to terms with what had happened. Jesus had died and then after the resurrection he had been amongst them and then they had to let Him go again and wait for the promised Spirit to be upon them.

We are waiting now in between lockdown dates, to discover whether It will be safe to relax restrictions and plan for a more 'normal' summer. Whilst I was trying to remember the sequence of events last year, for my annual report, I looked up the dates of the national and local lockdowns, and of the changing regulations, and this made me realise just how difficult 2020 had been. And yet we have come through it, not without great cost, but by making positive contributions to others' wellbeing. Even though we may be in a hurry to reclaim our freedoms, we will need to take time to reflect upon the full enormity of the situation we have been through. Time can't be hurried. But with patience and prayer, like the disciples at Pentecost, we can be joyful as we recognise that the Holy Spirit is with us, guiding and sustaining us as we take the next steps in our recovery.
